#### **Executive Summary:**

# **Details of Requested Agenda Report:**

The extreme heatwave and an extended period without rain this summer has once again tested our water systems. Particularly in Roma and Surat. While areas in our communities where we have invested heavily in new infrastructure have performed well under trying conditions; there were other areas that highlighted the need for further urgent investment. Water is an essential service and part of Council's core business. It is Council's responsibility to ensure our core services are delivered as a priority to our communities over "fluffy" or nice to have projects.

#### **Executive Summary:**

Proposal for Council to set a population growth target for the Maranoa Region to support the region's liveability for residents.

#### **Councillor's Recommendation:**

That Council consider:

- 1. Adopting a sustainable population target for our region of 20,000 people.
- Complete a liveability study and assessment by a respected demographer in the current budget deliberations to reinforce the need for an increased population target and regional liveability.

#### **Details of Requested Agenda Report:**

The issue around the future financial sustainability of our region runs in parallel with population growth. Whilst our region is growing steadily, only by approx. 350 people from 2006 to 2016; it is imperative for Council to set itself a population growth target because with the increased standard of liveability expected by our residents we need a larger population to spread the financial burden.

Within our communities the infrastructure and facilities are capable of servicing a larger population and are often under-utilised. Higher usage of our facilities would help spread the burden of maintaining them and would ultimately justify upgrading them.
