SUBJECT HEADING: Donation of Wedge-tailed Eagle Sculpture

Officer's Title: Project and Adminstration Officer

Executive Summary:

Maranoa Regional Council has received a letter from Injune Arts Inc. wishing to donate its purchased sculpture titled 'Wedge-tailed Eagle' by Stuart Taylor.

This sculpture was part of the 2024 Sculptures Out Back exhibition which has since ended. The committee wish to donate the sculpture to Council to enable it to be installed in an appropriate location within Injune for the enjoyment of the community and visitors to the Region.

Officer's Recommendation:

That Council:

- 1. Accept the donation of the sculpture known as 'Wedge-tailed Eagle by Artist Stuart Taylor.
- 2. Undertake community and staff consultation to establish the best location within the Injune Multipurpose Precinct.
- 3. Investigate the cost of installation of the artwork in the township of Injune.

Context (Why is the matter coming before Council?):

Injune Arts Inc do not have the capacity to install or provide the needed insurance for this artwork and ask that Council please accept this donation and therefore the responsibility of the installation and insurance of this artwork within Injune.

Background (Including any previous Council decisions):

Injune Arts Inc purchased the sculpture 'Wedge-tailed Eagle' by Stuart Taylor for \$23,000 with funding partners, Santos, Maranoa Regional Council, and other community and private donors.

A community survey was conducted by Council to gather feedback from the community on the recommended location for the install however more consultation is needed to establish the best location for the installation of this sculpture in Injune.

Currently the sculpture is being housed at the Roma Depot to ensure its safety until it can be safely installed in Injune.

Costs to install this artwork is yet to be considered but a report to council will be provided with the location and costings of the installation outlined for Councils endorsement.

Options Considered:

From the previous survey conducted by Council the most popular location for installation of the artwork was within the Injune Multipurpose precinct. From the survey over 134 responses were received with 56 votes going to the Injune Multipurpose Precinct.

Recommendation:

That Council:

- 1. Accept the donation of the sculpture known as 'Wedge tailed Eagle by Artist Stuart Taylor.
- 2. Undertake community consultation to establish the best location within the Injune Multipurpose Precinct.
- 3. Investigate the cost to install the artwork in the township of Injune.

Risks:

Risk	Description of likelihood & consequences
Not accepting the donation	Injune Arts Inc may fall into financial difficulty if they are held responsible for the installation and insurance for this piece, therefore the piece may never be installed
Accepting the donation	Council will take on the financial responsibility of the install and insurance costs for this piece of artwork. Council will also need to consider the security of this piece of art.

Policy and Legislative Compliance:

Asset Management Policy -

Council delivers a broad range of services to the Maranoa community through an extensive network of infrastructure assets. To facilitate the continuous and

sustainable provision of services in line with the community's vision, Council will operate as an asset-intensive organisation that is committed to:

- Ensuring all relevant legislative requirements, together with social, economic and environmental issues, are taken into account in asset management.
- Ensuring that maintenance programs are in place to ensure service levels, as defined in Asset Management Plans, are capable of achieving these agreed service levels.

Responsibilities — Council

Act as custodians and trustees for infrastructure assets.

A cost to transport, install and insure this sculpture will fall to Council to fund in future budgets.

Timelines / Deadlines:

Ideally this sculpture should be installed before tourism season starts in 2025
